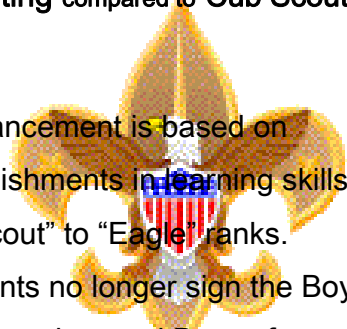


Boy Scouting compared to Cub Scouting

1. Advancement is based on accomplishments in learning skills from "Scout" to "Eagle" ranks.
2. Parents no longer sign the Boys' books. Leaders and Boys of upper ranks sign books. Boys then pass a "Board of Review" discussion to achieve each rank advancement.
3. Boys start working on merit badges which are skill-based and necessary to complete upper rank advancements.
4. Leadership is taught through scouting, but becomes more important the older the Boy becomes.
5. Outdoor activities become the focus rather than arts, crafts and smaller projects.
6. Boys' activities include long-term summer camp or high adventure camp and may include activities like rock climbing, rifle shooting, canoe trips, cycling trips, hiking trips and others.
